

La Pair'e Poker – Version 2

Rules of Play

INTRODUCTION

La Pair'e is played with one standard deck that includes two jokers for a total of 54 cards. Twenty-seven card graphics are displayed, outlined in blue, in two columns on the layout. Each card, 2 through 10 and Ace, King, Queen, Jack are printed in color and rank only, i.e. minus the suit designations. Thirteen red cards represent the various ranks of diamonds and hearts and thirteen black cards represent the various ranks of clubs and spades. One joker is printed separately at the head of the columns. There is one required wager named First Card. It is a bet on any of the twenty-seven cards and can be place straight up on one card, split on two cards, three cards or four cards. The winning First Card is the first card of the three-card poker hand. An identical set of cards is symbolized in a "racetrack" fashion in front of the dealer. It accommodates the optional La Pair'e wager. There are four more optional bets: La Pair'e Poker, played against the three-card poker payable, Any Pair'e, First Card Red and First Card Black. All bets are made before the deal.

THE DEAL

Three cards are dealt face down. The first card is turned face up and placed in its Gold outlined box. It is the winning First Card. The dealer places a marker on the chip(s) bet on that card. The second card is turned face up. It is the winning Pair'e Card and is placed in its red outlined box and a marker is placed on its winning chip(s). The First Card and La Pair'e Card wagers are settled. Then the third card is dealt face up, placed in its respective box and together the three cards make the three-card Poker hand.

SETTLEMENT

First Card

The bet wins when the card bet on is the same rank as the First Card.

Outcome	Pay
Joker Straight Up	25 to 1
1 Card Straight Up	12 to 1
2 Cards Split	5 to 1
3 Cards Joker, 7, K	4 to 1
3 Cards Ace, 2, 8	3 to 1
4 Cards Corner	2 to 1
1 Card Red (Diamond or Heart)	1 to 1
1 Card Black (Club or Spade)	1 to 1

Second Card

La Pair'e (Specific Paire) - Any specific Paire with the 1st two cards. A bet on a rank or joker wins if the card is the same rank or joker as the First Card.

Pair Wager	Outcome	Pay
Joker	Both Cards Match	300 for 1
	1 Card Match	10 for 1
2-A	Both Cards Match	50 for 1
	1 Card Match	5 for 1

Any Pair'e - The bet wins when the first and second cards are of the same rank.

Outcome	Pay
Pair of Jokers	50 to 1
Ace Thru Kings	16 to 1

Third Card

3rd card Poker hand - One joker is wild for the Mini Royal through Flush; one Joker maybe be used to substitute for any card that is not already present in the hand.

Hand	Pay
Two Jokers	100 to 1
AKQ Suited	50 to 1
Straight Flush	20 to 1
Three of a Kind	10 to 1
Straight	3 to 1
Flush	2 to 1
All other hands	Loss
